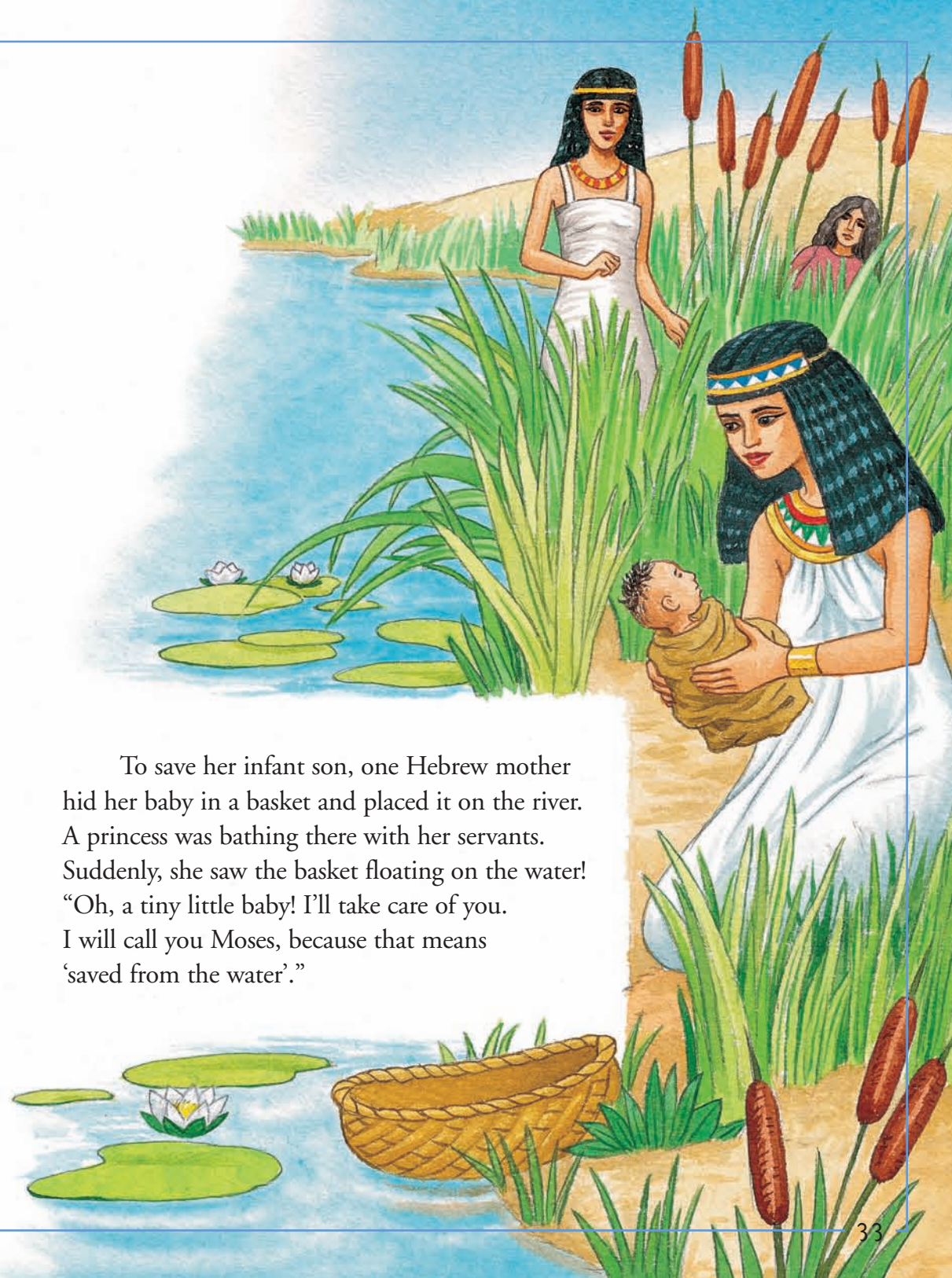


Moses Saved from the Water

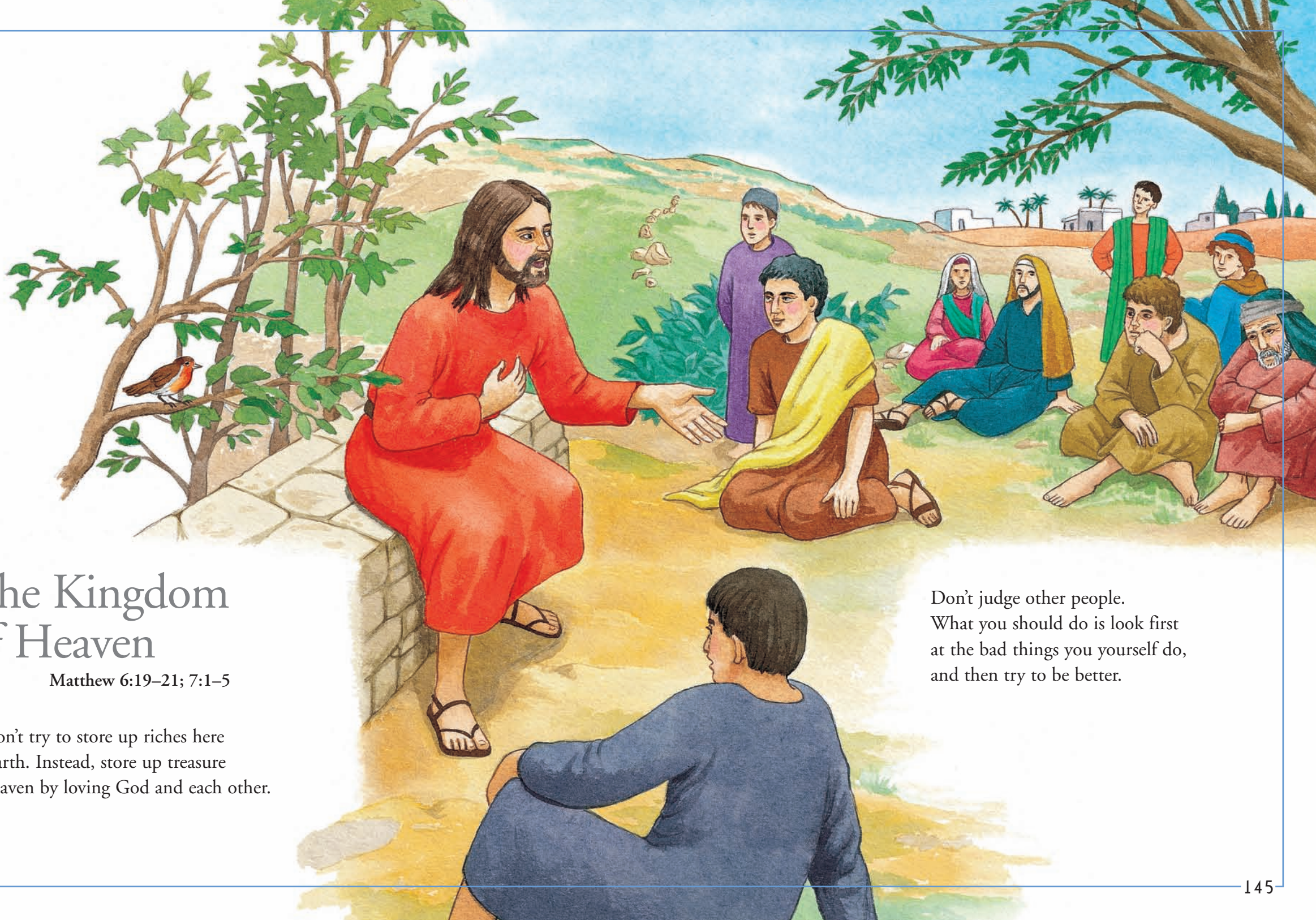
Exodus 1:1—2:10

Pharaoh was worried: “There are too many of these Hebrews living in our country! One day, they could make war on us... We must force them to work for us without pay!” Even as slaves the Hebrews grew in number, so Pharaoh ordered that their newborn sons be killed. What a terrible panic! Egyptian soldiers broke into all the houses and carried off the babies!
